OUR APPROACH

Our team focuses on helping infants and children improve their ability to eat. We take into account each patient's physical abilities, medical requirements and nutritional needs.

OUR MULTIDISCIPLINARY TEAM



- Occupational therapists
- Speech-language pathologists
- Registered dietitian

We assess and treat babies, kids and teens with a wide variety of diagnoses and causes for feeding disorders, including:

- · Chewing and swallowing difficulty
- Developmental delay
- Selective eating, autism, ARFID
- Oral aversion
- Breast- or bottle-feeding difficulty
- Tube-feeding support or weaning

STANDARDIZATION OF CARE

Our goal is to create a therapeutic environment that is positive and nurturing, where all children can achieve favorable outcomes.

This past fiscal year, we added an evidenced-based outcomes measure to our EMR, the Feeding Impact Scale.

COLLABORATION

When appropriate, we work closely with health care providers and community resources (health departments, WIC, school administrators, etc.) to provide your child with appropriate resources. We also collaborate with our Early Development program to provide NICU stepdown care for infants with persisting feeding difficulties after an inpatient stay.

VITAL STIMULATION THERAPY

We have two speech-language pathologists certified in neuromuscular electrical stimulation (NMES), also known as vital stimulation therapy. This can be a helpful tool for treating children at risk for aspiration. The non-invasive treatment, in conjunction with exercises, promotes swallowing safety.






VIDEOFLUOROSCOPIC SWALLOW STUDY

Our trained therapists complete videofluoroscopic (x-ray) imaging of swallowing function in infants and children who have suspected swallowing safety concerns. This is a key tool used in identification of aspiration and is essential in diagnosis and treatment of certain swallowing disorders.

This year our team of therapists completed 192 swallow studies.

Last year, we were able to continue providing patients with registered dietitian support, thanks to a generous gift from Amway. Demand for dietitian services has increased due to the growing number of patients we are serving. Grant support is vital in order to provide these services to our patients.




